

News and notes about San Marino

- **(b)** Southern California Edison's (SCE) consolidated rate change, which took effect Aug. 5, 2004, resulted in a system-wide 0.34% average rate decrease for bundled service customers, including a 1.05% average rate decrease for small and medium-sized power bundled service customers. The consolidated rate change was designed to reduce the impact to customers who otherwise would have experienced multiple rate changes in a relatively short period of time. Please keep in mind that specific impacts on your organization's rates may vary.
- (b) Did you see Merrill Shindler's article on **San Marino Seafood** in the *Pasadena Star-News* just before Christmas? Evidently a lot of folks did. George Banks reported that they were flooded with customers. And he's not complaining. I wonder how long his regulars are going to have to wait for a table now?
- (b) Speaking of eating, the name of the new Thai restaurant in San Marino is TANGDONG. Barbara Veenstra (Citizens Business Bank) reports that the food is great. Now we just have to recruit the owners to be Chamber members.

The evening will include Un Chien Andalou (1929) by Dali and Bunuel, Meshes in the Afternoon (1943) by Maya Deren, Dogstar Man (1962) by Stan Brakhage and The Order (2002) by Mathew Barney. Then on Saturday, February 26 the theme will be La Femme Fatale. The two feature films for that evening will be The Bride Wore Black (1968) by Francois Truffaut and Lady Snowblood (1973) by Toshiya Fujita. These free programs begin at 8 p.m. at Chouinard, 1020 Mission Street in South Pasadena.

It seems that The Sycamores supporter Todd Doney won "A Day at the Rose Bowl" at a fundraiser in April 2004. He came up with the idea of a "Battle at the Bowl," as a way to help out The Sycamores programs. He got together two teams of realtors from the area for a flag football competition, which raised \$25,000 for the Sycamores. The event included the full use of the Rose Bowl football field and scoreboard, home and visitor team locker rooms, and live audio/video feed, with action highlights and instant replays shown in real-time on the video scoreboard. UCLA Bruins sportscaster, Chris Roberts announced the game. The two-hour game ended with a celebratory barbecue on the field for all participants, patrons and fans.
- **②** Tom Bristow promises that his third **UPS Store** will open any day in Alhambra. The delay was due to a required inspection to be done by the Alhambra Fire Department. Until this new store opens, Tom suggests you keep coming to the San Marino location at 2275 Huntington Drive.
- ② At a recent San Marino Rotary Club Meeting, members heard the story of how twenty-three student members of Interact Club at San Marino's Southwestern Academy raised \$1800 to purchase "shelter boxes." The Shelter Box Project assembles a tunnel tent, sleeping bags, light and heat sources, water purification and cooking equipment, and tools in a large plastic box. Each box is designed to support about ten people for several months, and can be stored at major international airports to be rushed to disaster sites. They cost \$900 each. The Southwestern Interact Club members have funded nine boxes this semester so far. The students created and manufactured Christmas tree decorations to fund the first two boxes. After the tsunami hit, they gathered contributions for seven more. Our hats are off to the Southwestern Interact Club and Rotary for this mighty relief effort.
