Nancy Billings Announces Her Retirement



In January, Nancy Billings, one of the owners of Shutters, announced her retirement. Nancy has been an important voice in the San Marino business community for two decades. First, as the founder and owner of Cricket's, a unique gift store, she set a fine example of how a small retail shop could serve an ever-growing circle of customers. People

traveled from many surrounding communities to purchase her specially selected gift items. She exhibited excellent taste in the items she presented to her customers and displayed them attractively. "High quality and unique style at reasonable prices," is the way someone characterized the store.

While owning and operating Cricket's, Nancy accepted the presidency of the Chamber of Commerce in 1998, at a time when the Chamber desperately needed reorganizing. During her two years in office, she supervised the updating of the Chamber office, the birth of the Chamber Green Sheet, the renewal of the monthly Chamber mixer tradition, and worked with the City of San Marino to re-establish channels of communication between the City and the business community. She was instrumental in attracting retail businesses and restaurants to San Marino. She formed a committee to celebrate the first Christmas Around the Drive.

In March 2003, after closing Cricket's, she began a partnership with Ceil Mortimer, Barbara Brereton, Denise Wines and An Jungerhaus. This group of women opened Shutters in the former Cricket's location on Huntington Drive. She led the new store through its infancy and proved that the same quality and taste would continue in the new store.

The San Marino business community is indebted to her work and accomplishments over the years. She has been tireless in her dedication to the Chamber, to the business community and to the City of San Marino. Nancy Billings has been an example for others to follow. We wish her well and are grateful for her influence upon us.

News and notes about San Marino

- The Huntington Library, Art Galleries and Botanical Gardens recently announced that it has received a \$1 million gift from actor-writer Steve Martin to support American art exhibits and to help the institution acquire American Art. As the Huntington expands its exhibit space with the addition of the Lois and Robert F. Erburu Gallery, this gift is quite timely. Martin has also loaned American paintings from his own collection to the Huntington.
- **GEO Chiropractic** is sponsoring Operation H.O.P.E. again this year. They are Helping Other People Eat on Tuesday, March 8, when they will accept two bags of nonperishable groceries in exchange for chiropractic care. Food will be donated to the Salvation Army.
- The new owner of the Tribune building hopes to use it as an office building. They are not planning to modify the exterior. They value its architectural/historical significance -- that's good news.


